WHAT IS REMODULIN?

Remodulin is a prescription medication used to treat adults with pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH; WHO Group 1), which is high blood pressure in the arteries of your lungs. Remodulin can reduce symptoms associated with exercise. Remodulin was studied mainly in patients with NYHA Functional Class II-IV symptoms. It is not known if Remodulin is safe and effective in children.

In people with PAH who need to switch from epoprostenol, Remodulin is approved to slow the worsening of symptoms.

- Have other medical conditions or take other medicines that may affect your use of Remodulin by increasing the risk of side effects or decreasing the drug's effectiveness.

Remodulin acts like natural prostacyclin in your body to help keep the blood vessels in your lungs open.

Helping you to be more active

Remodulin helps make it easier for your heart to pump blood through your lungs by providing the prostacyclin your body needs throughout the day.

Remodulin can reduce your PAH symptoms, such as shortness of breath and fatigue, and improve certain factors used to evaluate the risk of your disease getting worse.

Pump options designed with you in mind

Remodulin is delivered through a pump system, not unlike those used by people with diabetes. With Remodulin, you get continuous delivery of medicine 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, so you can feel confident you're getting the medicine you need at all times. And, United Therapeutics continues to develop pump options to help simplify the delivery of Remodulin.

Administering Remodulin may take some getting used to, but just take it step by step and lean on the support available from your Specialty Pharmacy nurse and healthcare team. Together, you can find a way to incorporate Remodulin into your daily routine and lifestyle.

- Worsening of PAH symptoms. Do not stop taking or greatly reduce your Remodulin dose without consulting your doctor.
- Low blood pressure (symptomatic hypotension). If you have low blood pressure or are taking drugs that lower your blood pressure, the risk of low blood pressure is increased.

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Subcutaneous (SC) Remodulin

SC Remodulin is delivered to the body via a very thin tube (cannula) inserted just beneath the skin.

How SC Remodulin benefits you:

- Small, discreet pump options (smaller than IV pumps)
- No surgery necessary
- Less risk of bloodstream infections compared to IV administration
- Enhanced convenience—medication does not need to be mixed at home
- Most SC pumps need to be refilled every 2 to 3 days

SC is the preferred way to take Remodulin because of the reduced risk of bloodstream infections.

The Remunity Pump for Remodulin was specifically designed with you in mind. Only 2" in diameter, 3/4" thick, and weighing just 1.7 ounces, Remunity provides a more discreet option for SC delivery.

With Remunity, cassettes can either be filled at home by you or your caregiver, or prefilled by your Specialty Pharmacy and delivered directly to your home.

Intravenous (IV) Remodulin

IV Remodulin is delivered directly into the bloodstream via a narrow, flexible tube called a catheter, which is placed into a vein in your upper chest. The procedure may require an overnight hospital stay.

How IV Remodulin benefits you:

- Medication is prepared either by you at home or by the Specialty Pharmacy, which will ship premixed cassettes directly to you
- Pump reservoir is usually refilled every 2 days
- No infusion site pain typically seen
- No ice packs needed for administration

A Specialty Pharmacy nurse will be there to support you so that you can feel confident starting pump therapy with IV Remodulin. Your healthcare team can also help enroll eligible^{*} patients into a premix program to save time and avoid any potential errors when mixing the medicine.

*The SPmix Program is for patients who are taking a consistent dose of Remodulin for at least a month and have been self-mixing for at least 3 months.

Getting started with Remodulin

As you begin treatment, you'll be surrounded by a team that can provide support every step of the way, help ensure your questions are answered, and help you feel confident moving forward with your Remodulin therapy.



1: Complete the Referral Form

Your healthcare team will begin the treatment initiation process by filling out and submitting your Referral Form to a Specialty Pharmacy provider.



2: Check insurance coverage

The Specialty Pharmacy or your doctor's office will contact your insurance company to help determine and verify coverage for you. They can determine if you qualify for the Co-Pay Assistance Program.

TIP: Your insurance company or Specialty Pharmacy will reach out to you to discuss your coverage, so be sure to answer your phone.



3: Start your Remodulin therapy

You will be connected with a dedicated Specialty Pharmacy nurse who can provide support and education, along with at-home training on how to prepare your medicine and use your pump. The nurse will come as many times as needed to help you feel comfortable with your therapy.



4: Ship supplies on schedule

The Specialty Pharmacy will take care of coordinating the delivery of your medicine and supplies. They will send refills and supplies on a regular schedule so you always have it when you need it.



5: Connect to support services

You can access various support resources and programs through United Therapeutics, such as the Remodulin Support Program, social community (Facebook and YouTube), and more.
